Dear Donor,

When I walk through SIUT's hospitals, I see what compassion looks like in motion. I see nurses working through the night, physicians making impossible decisions with calm resolve, families waiting with quiet faith and patients who arrive frightened and leave with dignity. This is the reality your support makes possible.

In 2025, SIUT delivered free healthcare to over 4.5 million people.

That number is staggering, but what it truly represents is millions of individual moments; mothers reassured, children stabilized, lives held together in moments of crisis. Every patient received care without being asked a single question about their ability to pay.

Behind the scenes, delivering care at this scale requires relentless commitment. Last year, SIUT provided more than 518,000 dialysis sessions, sustaining patients whose lives depend on consistency and continuity. The emergency teams responded to nearly 300,000 urgent cases, often in situations where time was a difference between life and loss. Across hospitals, over 138,000 surgeries were performed each one the result of careful coordination, expertise, and trust.

What makes SIUT exceptional is not only the volume of care delivered, but the discipline and values that guide it. Every test ordered, every procedure performed, and every patient followed up reflects a system designed around fairness, accountability, and respect. This is healthcare stripped of privilege and powered instead by purpose.

As Executive Director, I am deeply aware that none of this happens by chance. It happens because of people who believe that access to care should never depend on wealth. Your support sustains the systems, people, and principles that allow SIUT to function every single day.

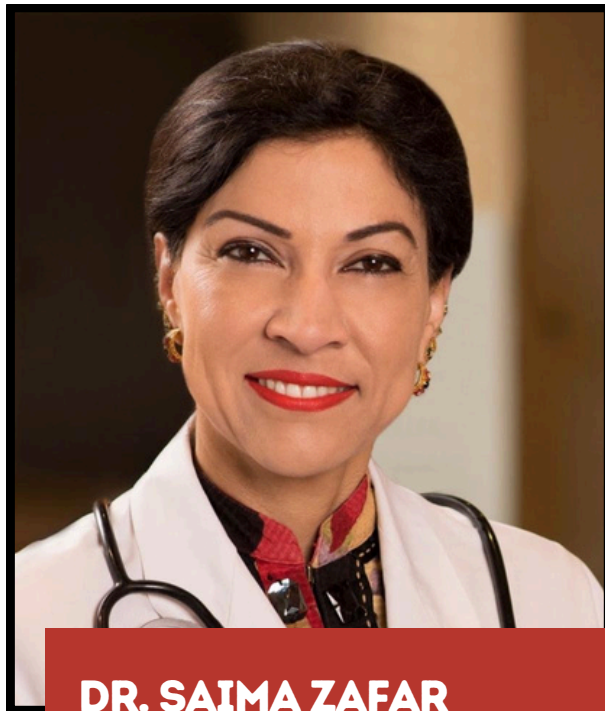

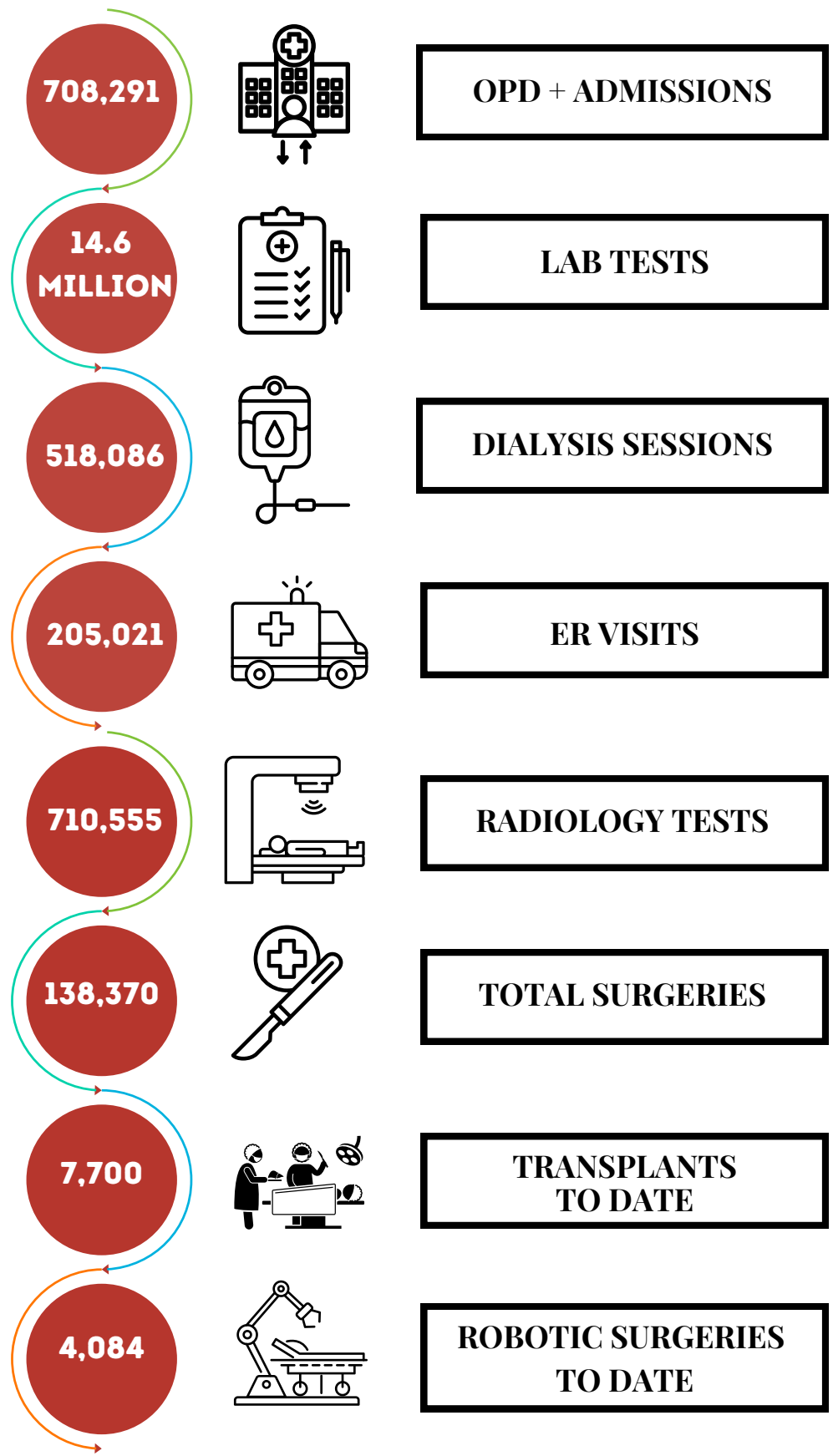

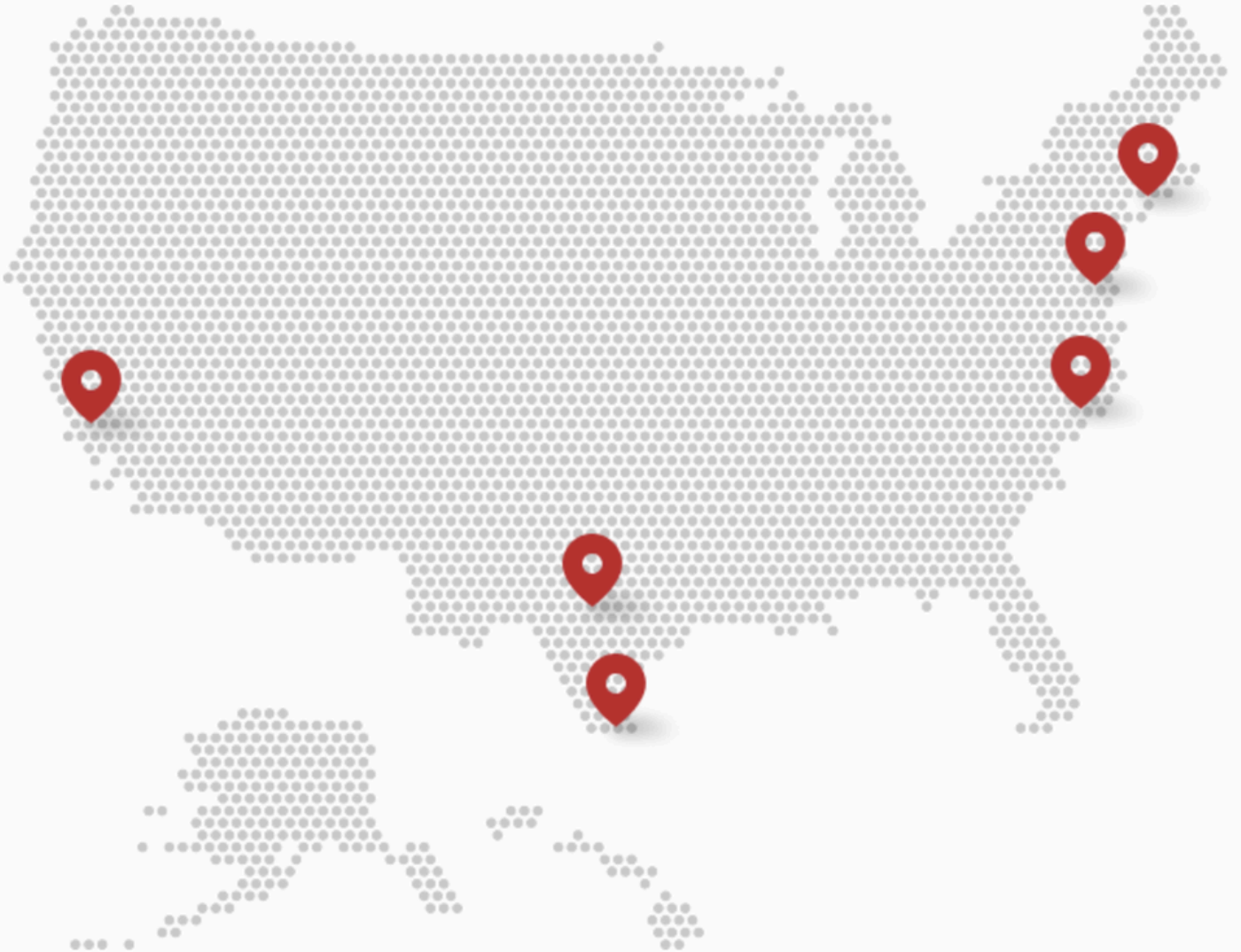

From its headquarters in Houston, SIUT North America is steadily expanding its footprint across the country, building new chapters and strengthening its mission to support free, dignified healthcare.

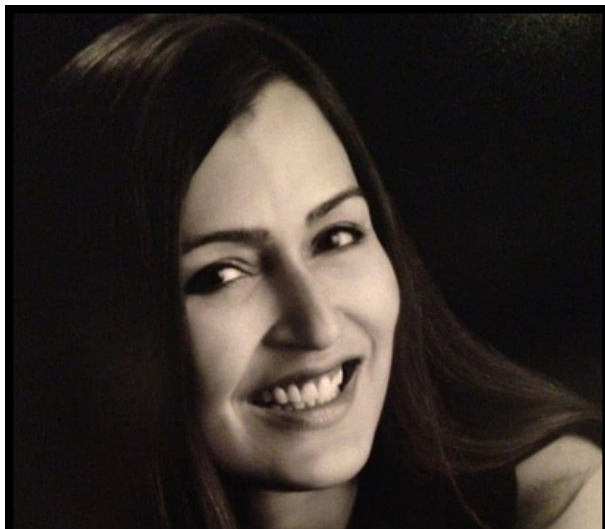
CHAPTER LEADS

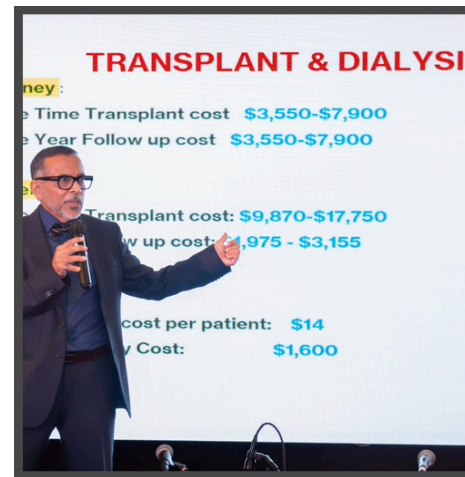
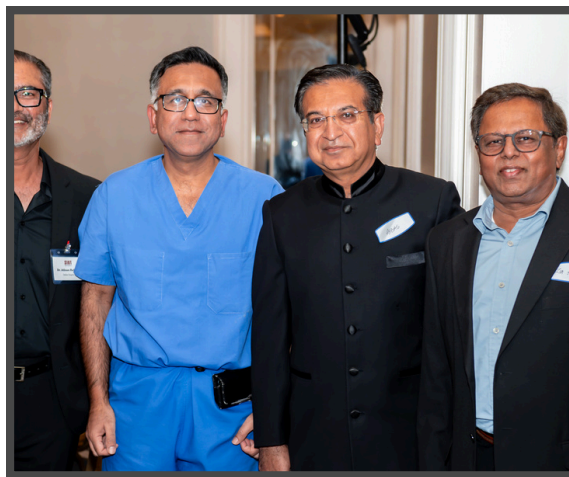

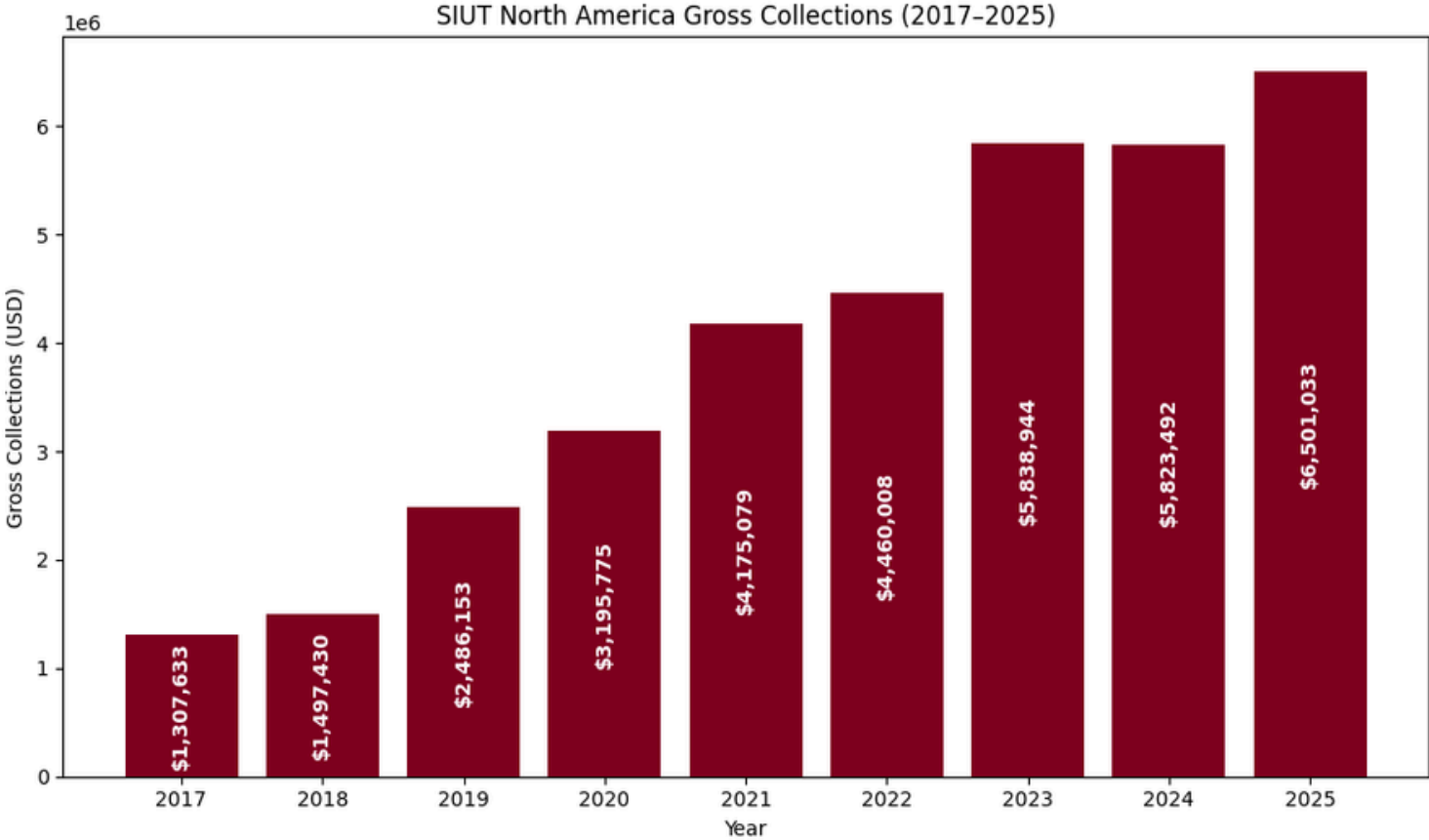
DALLAS GALA
